The well-manicured fairways are sometimes tight and largely flat. Golfers do have to carefully plot their way around the course. Playing Baltinglass is not exhausting and can be supplemented with trolley or buggy-hire.

We have an all-year round golf course that is challenging to golfers of all levels.

Playing Golf

We pride ourself on our inclusiveness. New members needn't concern themselves with getting a game. Booking via the BRS app (or phoning the office) is now essential for day-to-day golf. Turning up, hoping for a game, and finding yourself in a queue for the 1st. tee is a thing of the past since booking became compulsory.

Lady members have competitions on Thursday's and Sundays.

The very enjoyable weekly seniors 'OFS' is on every Wednesday.

Organised 'social' golf such as the 12 hole Balto Social on Friday evenings during the summer is a feature of the club and a great way to meet new golfers.

Weekend competitions can be booked on-line, as is the case with some midweek competitions. Inter-club golf includes teams for Mixed, Ladies, Men's Juveniles and Seniors.

The course is carefully managed to promote biodiversity. A programme of planting native tree species is continuing. Pollinator friendly flowers and shrubs are grown. Natural habitat is preserved to facilitate wild animals such as deer, squirrels, including red squirrels, and rabbits. Moorhens, buzzards and woodpecker can be seen regularly. Various types of butterflies and bees are notable.
